Bible Memory

One of the benefits of memorizing Bible verses is that God’s Spirit uses Scripture to call us to faith in Christ and Scripture is the primary means by which we are disciplined. While some educators and parents may fear that children are merely committing meaningless words to memory, we believe that truth committed to memory provides a firm foundation for growth. Please note that all Bible references are ESV unless otherwise stated. A few verses are taken from the NIV because of ease of reading.

Some Bible verses are stand-alone and others build on each other. The following Bible passages build on each other:

Suggested Learning Activities for Bible Memory:

- Memorize the verses with your child.
- Discuss the verses with your child as he or she is memorizing them.
- Define the difficult terms. Some of the difficult terms have been defined for you.
- Determine your child’s level of understanding by asking your child to put the verse in his or her own words.
- Pray with and for your child.
- Encourage precise memorization of the verses.
- Go at your child’s own rate. Older children who have just started should begin at the earliest level before advancing to their grade level.
- Review previous verses. This will facilitate verses becoming part of your child’s long-term memory. If you do not review these verses with you child, they will not retain what they have learned.

A Catechism for Children

Revised by Wayne Shealy

A catechism is a summary of Christian doctrine/teaching in the form of questions and answers. Catechizing has been a time-honored and effective practice throughout the history of the church, dating back to the early church and practiced by the Reformers (e.g., John Calvin, Martin Luther), the Puritans, and many present day Christians. The word “catechism” itself comes from a Greek word used in the Bible, *katacheo*, which means “instruction” (Luke 1:4).

There are several good reasons to use a catechism with your children. First, a catechism encourages the unity of essential Christian beliefs. It focuses on the primary teachings of the Bible and equips parents with short, theologically-rich responses to basic questions regarding Christian doctrine. Second, a catechism stimulates and promotes gospel-centered conversations among parents and children. Many of the questions and answers are such that they provoke further and deeper questions in children, providing parents with an opportunity to turn their children’s attention to Jesus. Third, a catechism promotes the usefulness (necessity, authority, sufficiency, clarity) of God’s Word because it connects Bible verses to doctrinal statements. Children begin to value God’s Word as they see how clearly it answers important questions.

The history of this particular catechism can be traced to the Westminster Shorter Catechism, as revised by Baptist Puritans, and then further revised and put into contemporary language by several modern day pastors and theologians. This catechism is broken up into six sections:

1. Questions about God, People, and Sin (Questions 1-35)
2. Questions about the Ten Commandments (Questions 36-62)
3. Questions about Salvation (Questions 63-97)
4. Questions about Prayer (Questions 98-115)
5. Questions about the Bible, the Church and the Ordinances (Questions 116-127)
6. Questions about Last Things (Questions 128-136)

By oppression and judgment he was taken away; and as for his generation, who considered that he was cut off out of the land of the living, stricken for the transgression of my people? And they made his grave with the wicked and with a rich man in his death, although he had done no violence, and there was no deceit in his mouth. Yet it was

the will of the Lord to crush him; he has put him to grief; when his soul makes an offering for guilt, he shall see his offspring; he shall prolong his days; the will of the Lord shall prosper in his hand. Out of the anguish of his soul he shall see and be satisfied; by his knowledge shall the righteous one, my servant, make many to be accounted righteous, and he shall bear their iniquities. Therefore I will divide him a portion with the many, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong, because he poured out his soul to death and was numbered with the transgressors; yet he bore the sin of many, and makes intercession for the transgressors.
